Invite Joseph Farr into your classroom this year for an interactive discussion about the Emancipation Proclamation.

Joseph Farr, a station master on the Underground Railroad, helped many enslaved people brought to Minnesota in the 1850s escape bondage. Farr, portrayed by a costumed educator, will take your students back to a turbulent era in this nation's history.

Students can imagine themselves as enslaved people seeking freedom, or as president Abraham Lincoln juggling the goals of emancipation. Farr will lead students in a discussion about the past, present and future of race and equality in the United States, and what it takes to be advocates for positive change.
